Project Synopsis: Florida is a sentinel state and will likely to continue to serve as an entry point for insect pests and plant diseases and their subsequent spread across large regions. Increased inspections of plants, plant materials and their conveyance and increased pest surveillance in the environs at Florida’s Agricultural Inspection Stations, marinas and canals through the deployment of personnel at interdiction stations in northern Florida and the marinas and canal systems of southeast Florida. This program will allow for the detection of plant pests that may accompany plant material destined for Florida.
