

8.5 SMA

- 1989 Flood Protection (Congress)
- 1992 Flood Mitigation (Corps)
- 1998 Full Buyout (SFWMD)
- 2000 3.5 Square Mile Area


Flow to South Dade

- 1989 Flow directed to the North and into ENP
- 2000 Flow directed south to C-111 Basin

S-356 Pump Station

- 1989 S-356 at 950 cfs with final capacity determined after 'further investigations'
- 2005 S-356 capped at 500 cfs, Further investigations doubtful.

CERP in South Miami-Dade




Canal Operations

- 2000 Component OO to improve flow to Rocky Glades in ENP also lowers canal levels
- 2005 CSOP eliminates flow to Rocky Glades and lower canal levels ?

C-111 Spreader

- 2000 No taking of productive land
- 2005 CERP C-111 Team looking at major disruption to private land in South Miami-Dade



C-111 Spreader Canal

2005 5,200 acres shown as potential 'Natural Storage and Water Treatment Area'

Public money will never be available to buy this land.
