Objective

- The Working Group and the Science Coordination Group are to help the Task Force coordinate plans, projects and science.
- The Working Group and Science Coordination Group have a number of routine and recurring tasks such as project consultations.
- Based on the current situation the following additional specific assignments are proposed.

Invasive Exotic Animal Plan

- Purpose: to prepare an intergovernmental plan that will identify key species and actions necessary to help control invasive exotic animals.

Climate Change Coordination

- Purpose: to provide a broad picture of the climate change research and actions (communication, mitigation, and adaptation) that are being planned or conducted by the various agencies relevant to the restoration of the South Florida Ecosystem.

Summary of New Science

- Purpose: to provide a plain language summary of the new scientific concepts that have evolved since the Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Plan (CERP) was authorized in 2000.
