Archbold Biological Station is an independent, non-profit research facility, devoted to long-term ecological research and conservation. The primary focus is on the organisms and environments of the unique Lake Wales Ridge and adjacent central Florida. The Station owns and manages a 5,140-acre, globally significant natural preserve. The Station also manages the MacArthur Agro-ecology Research Center (MAERC) at Buck Island Ranch.

Dr. Hilary Swain, Executive Director, will lead a walking tour of the scrub and facilities on Wednesday, 25 July, 8:30 AM, as part of the South Florida Ecosystem Restoration Task Force Meeting being held at Archbold.

For the tour it is recommended that you wear sturdy shoes (sneakers or hiking boots), sunscreen, and bring a water bottle.
